# Summer Student Internship

## About NAMHR

The priority of the National Network for Aboriginal Mental Health Research (NAMHR) is to train new researchers, especially from Aboriginal backgrounds, to develop the capacity for mental health research in Aboriginal communities.

## NAMHR Summer Student Internship Program

The NAMHR Summer Student Internship Program is a 10-week paid internship. The NAMHR internship projects are designed and supervised by members of the NAMHR. Interns work with these mentors in various aspects of the research process (planning, data collection, analysis, and/or synthesis). Research projects must be related to the one of the NAMHR research themes, which include: social and developmental determinants of mental health and well-being, healing and mental health services, substance abuse, suicide prevention and mental health promotion, child maltreatment, abuse and neglect and knowledge translation.

## Start Date

- Internships run for 10 weeks between June and August. Exact dates to be set at the discretion of the mentor.

## Eligibility

- Students must make prior arrangements to have their project supervised by a NAMHR co-investigator (<http://www.namhr.ca/mentors-coinvestigators.html>).
- Students must be enrolled in full-time undergraduate or graduate studies and returning to a recognized post-secondary program in September 2010.
- Students of Aboriginal ancestry are encouraged to apply.
- All funds must be used for student salary.

## Salary

- The NAMHR will provide funding support to each intern in the amount of \$4,000 for the 10-week period.

## To Apply

Students must submit an updated résumé and a letter of intent that includes their proposed NAMHR mentor, previous research experience, area of interest, current program of study, and future aspirations.

## Closing Date

March 26, 2010, or until all positions are filled.
